ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants should have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and demonstrate public service motivation.
- Standardized exam scores including GRE, LSAT and GMAT are optional.
- Admissions decisions are conducted on a rolling basis.

HOW DO I APPLY?

Applying for the Bloch MPA is easy! Just follow these steps:

- Visit umkc.edu/apply to complete a UMKC application and pay the \$45 application fee.
- Submit transcripts from all universities attended to the UMKC Office of Admissions. If electronic transcripts are available, they should be sent to **umkc-admtranscript@umkc.edu**.
- Submit a **current resume** and **statement of purpose** outlining your professional goals and how an MPA will support those goals.

Spring: Dec. 15

Summer: May 1
