Regulations and Expectations:

- *Students are responsible for program information included on this evaluation, on their advising forms, in the UMKC Undergraduate Catalog and on the Bloch School website. Students should take time to become familiar with the policies that apply to their program.
- *Minimum of 123 hours required; at least 30 hours, including 50% of business core and emphasis area courses, must be completed at UMKC. Students must earn a minimum of 15 hours of junior/senior-level accounting at UMKC. A minimum of 60 hours from UMKC is required for Latin honors eligibility.
- *Students transferring to UMKC need a 2.5 cumulative GPA to be admitted, and must maintain a 2.25 UM and in-major GPA thereafter. "Cumulative" means attempts on all college-level courses and includes repeats (unless excluded per UMKC/Bloch policy).
- *Bloch School undergraduate students must maintain 2.25 UM and in-major GPAs to remain in good standing in the program. UM and in-major GPAs are calculated on classes completed at UMKC and other UM campuses in Columbia, St. Louis & Rolla.
- *Academic advising is required PRIOR to enrollment for freshman and junior students, students on academic contract or probation.
- *ALEKS placement exam is required for enrollment in initial college-level math course at UMKC. Completion of pre-requisite or higher course at UMKC or elsewhere with required grade will allow enrollment in subsequent courses.
- *Take RooWriter Writing Assessment semester after completion of Discourse 2 and prior to earning 90 credit hours. Transfer students should complete the RooWriter in their first semester at UMKC. Acceptable RooWriter submission must be noted in Pathway in order to enroll in MGT 301. Students are allowed to enroll in MGT 301 prior to full assessment of RooWriter exam.
- *Students must complete the ETS Proficiency Profile (EPP) and RooWriter to meet graduation requirements.

Accounting Certification Descriptions and Course Recommendations

Each BS Accounting student will complete six hours (two courses) of upper-level accounting electives. Students are encouraged to make their selections based on their career and professional goals. To help in this process, the accounting faculty have recommended the following pairings relevant to certain professional credentials that can be earned after graduation. Please conduct your own research into these credentials and their eligibility requirements. Completing the recommended course sequence does not guarantee your eligibility to sit for these exams or your success in testing.

Certified Public Accountant, CPA®

Certified Public Accountants may work for large international firms or small organizations. CPAs are often what people think of when they hear the word "accountant." To achieve the title of Certified Public Accountant one must pass the Uniform CPA exam, an ethics exam, and meet post-certification continuing education requirements. Requirements to sit for the exam vary from state to state, but generally require completion of an accounting-related curriculum at the college or university-level. Specific course work, related work experience and a minimum number of college credit hours may also be required. Missouri and Kansas currently have specific course requirements and candidates must have a minimum of 150 college credit hours. Prospective candidates can pay for a review of their credentials to learn of outstanding requirements.

Certified Internal Auditor®, CIA®

Internal auditors provide independent, objective assurance and consulting work designed to add value and improve an organization's operations. They help an organization accomplish its objectives by bringing a systematic, disciplined approach to evaluate and improve the effectiveness of risk management, control, and governance processes. Requirements to sit for the CIA exam include educational requirements and a character reference. Upon passing the exam, work experience and post-certification continuing education are also required. Certified Management Accountant, CMA®

Management Accountants partner with businesses to aid in planning and decision making, creating performance management systems, and providing expertise in financial reporting and control. The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) exam was developed as a way to demonstrate proficiency in managerial accounting and financial management. Accounting and Finance students are encouraged to sit for the 2 part exam upon completion of recommended coursework before completion of their degree. Candidates for CMA certification must meet specific education and professional experience requirements to obtain their license. Post-certification continuing education is required. Certified Information Systems Auditor, CISA

The Information Systems Audit and Control Association (ISACA) stands at the cross roads of accounting and information systems and is a leader in the development of industry knowledge and practice. One of the ISACA certifications is that of an Information Systems Auditor (CISA) which signifies that the holder possesses the technical knowledge to effectively audit, control, monitor and assess IT. CISA certification is available to individuals in the information technology and business systems arena. Exam candidates must meet work experience requirements to be eligible for this certification. Your eligibility to be certified is based on a point system which awards credit for education, professional affiliations and experience. Post-certification continuing education is required.
