HOW DO I KNOW IF I'M A CANDIDATE?

You're a candidate for the Bloch Professional MBA if you:

- Are looking to expand your career through flexible courses, engagement with peers and instructors and connections to the Kansas City business community.
- Have two or more years of full-time work experience. Recent graduates who are working full time and have clear career goals may be considered as well.

HOW DO I APPLY?

Applying for the Bloch MBA is easy! Just follow these four steps:

1. Visit umkc.edu/apply to complete a UMKC application and pay the \$45 application fee.
2. Submit transcripts from all universities attended to the UMKC Office of Admissions. If your prior university provides electronic transcripts, they should be sent to umkc-admtranscript@umkc.edu. GMAT waivers may be available to applicants with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA *or* two years plus of work experience. For applicants that do not meet this criteria, automatic admission will be granted with a 600 score on the GMAT (or equivalent score on the GRE).
3. Submit a **current resume** and **one-page goal statement** describing your career plans and how an MBA will help you achieve them.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT FROM THE PROGRAM?

The Bloch Professional MBA is made up of seven foundation courses, one Application, Integration and Innovation class and four electives so you can hone essential business skills while also tailoring your degree to your career goals.
