Agile Leadership

What You Will Learn

This course is designed to explore the concept of agile management and leadership in the context of unique organizations. Participants will explore the importance of understanding agile concepts and principles and how best to align them with the culture and strategic direction of the organization. Participants will spend time learning how to adopt or expand desired agile approaches.

This course will focus on the origins of agile management for software development. Participants will be introduced to agile concepts and principles and how these can be more broadly adapted across the organization for project and functional management. Participants will be introduced to practical agile ideas and frameworks using case studies and exercises and learn how to apply these to their respective organization. The course will challenge participants to reflect on their organization and culture and how best to adapt agile principles for success.

Key Topics

- Principles and concepts around the origin of agile management in software development including the agile manifesto and key agile principles
- How agile concepts and principles can be adopted on a broader organizational basis to improve internal functional and project management
- How agile principles can be adopted in various organization cultures, what potential barriers may exist and key change management issues
- Review agile adoption case studies and examples
- Develop an agile manifesto and principles that can be adopted by your unique organization
