**EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY**

The Education Policy Center conducts a program of basic and applied research, analyses of education issues, and services for practitioners and policy-makers in Alabama and beyond. It hosts the UA Superintendent's Academy and professional activities for UA/COE faculty. Since 2005, more than \$4 million of externally funded grants and contracts have been received. The Center hosts visiting scholars involved in Center research projects. Major Center activities include: (1) The National Surveys of Access and Finance Issues of state-level higher education leaders, (2) studies of Pell Grants (19 have been conducted since 2010), and (3) serving as the research arm of the Rural Community College Alliance. Center work has been presented on Capitol Hill, at the White House Domestic Policy Issues' Rural Council, and at the U.S. Departments of Education and Agriculture. The Center is now a leading voice on education issues facing the Deep South, an area not well represented in federal education policy circles.
