Common Questions

- What about completion of Precalculus or Calculus-
 - Precalculus or Calculus will satisfy the Math Pathway requirement in UMKC Essentials and will waive the MATH 110 requirement in our degree program
- What about statistics courses other than DSOM 211?
 - If you completed a statistics course equivalent to STAT 235 or MOTR MATH 110, we are currently accepting those courses to satisfy the DSOM 211 requirement.
- BSA program designed to meet MO req'ts; CPA eligibility KS only- need another business law, upper-level Econ and basic computer applications




Graduation Plans
