



# Special General Education Options for Transfer Students

- Associates of Arts degree from a regionally accredited school will fulfill all general education requirements
- Transfer students also have the opportunity to opt to complete <u>Missouri Core 42 General</u> <u>Education</u> requirements if it means fewer classes



# Missouri Core 42



- 9 hours -Social and Behavioral Sciences
   2 disciplines including one Civics course
- 6 hours Written Communication
- 3 hours- Oral Communication
- 7 hours- Natural Sciences
   2 disciplines including one course with a lab
- 3 hours- Mathematical Science
- 9 hours- Humanities and Fine Arts
  - 2 disciplines (only 3 hours of performance work)
- 5 hours- Electives to meet the required 42 hours



# **General Electives**

General Electives to bring program total to 120; number will vary depending on courses selected in General Education. Only two hours of PE activity will be counted. No vocational, remedial or military science courses will apply.

• The number of hours of elective a student will need will vary depending on transfer credit and choices made in fulfilling general education requirements

# **Common Questions**

- What about completion of Precalculus or Calculus-
  - Precalculus or Calculus will satisfy the Math Pathway requirement in UMKC Essentials and will waive the MATH 110 requirement in our degree program
- What about statistics courses other than DSOM 211?
  - If you completed a statistics course equivalent to STAT 235 or MOTR MATH 110, we are currently accepting those courses to satisfy the DSOM 211 requirement.
- BSA program designed to meet MO req'ts; CPA eligibility KS only- need another business law, upperlevel Econ and basic computer applications class


